Message from the Principal, Mr White

I would like to start by saying a huge thank you to all of you for your support during the first half term. This has been unprecedented within my teaching career and the positive way in which staff and students have approached the changes due to COVID has been excellent. The long lockdown during the spring and summer has undoubtedly impacted the progress of students and we are undertaking work to minimise the disruption to learning that has taken place. I am proud of how our students have settled back into school life, after such a long time away, throughout the first national lockdown. It has been really impressive to see how well everyone has adapted to the changes in the school routine.



As you will be aware, we have had a number of members of our school community test positive for COVID-19. We have followed all Public Health England guidance to ensure that all students and staff remain safe. Our COVID procedures continue to go above and beyond government recommendations and I believe this has assisted in keeping our infection levels low across the school. Students continue to follow the new routines, using hand sanitiser when they enter and leave all areas around the school, wearing masks in all communal areas during the day, helping to ensure everyone remains safe.

Should any student need to self-isolate, we are delivering remote learning via Microsoft Teams. All of our students have had sessions in school on how to logon and use Microsoft Teams. A user guide is also available on our website. Please encourage and support your child wherever possible, by finding an appropriate place for them to work, suggesting they communicate with their teacher should they require help, checking that set work is being completed and submitted by the end of each day and finally ensuring that they follow their own school timetable wherever possible.

Attendance last half term, in spite of all the challenges students have faced, was extremely positive. A significant number of students achieved a 100% attendance record. I would like to say well done to all of those students. Whilst I appreciate students may have to self-isolate from time to time, please support us in ensuring your child attends school whenever possible. Should any further cases arise in school, we will determine which students are affected and notify parents individually, confirming what action needs to be taken based wholly on Public Health England guidance. If we have not made direct contact with you, you should assume that your child should continue to attend school.

It was a busy and long half term and students worked extremely hard. I hope you all managed to get a well-deserved rest over the half-term break and that you and your families remain safe and well. 
