
Police and traffic wardens are monitoring parking. Please note that no waiting time is allowed in the areas where yellow lines are present and traffic

### **Senior Maths Challenge 2019**

Forty-nine A level Mathematics students from NUAST took part in the 90 minute brain workout of the Senior Mathematics Challenge, organised by the UKMT based at Leeds University. Impressive then, that five of our students achieved gold certificates with one student, Nathan Taylor, invited to participate in the UKMT Olympiad competition. This is devised to put the very best mathematical brains around the world against one another. Oliver Leask, Farhan Kamil-Okedara, John Hills and William Marshall were also awarded gold certificates and progress to the regional Kangaroo competition. Fourteen students achieved silver certificates and a further fourteen were awarded bronze certificates.

On 20th November a team of four: Nathan Taylor, Oliver Leask, Aiden Gall and Oscar Findley, took part in the regional final of the Senior Team Mathematics Challenge at the University of Nottingham, competing against nineteen other schools from both the independent and state sectors across the East Midlands. The NUAST team achieved 5th place in the competition. This is now our third consecutive year of NUAST placing in the top 25% at the competition, reflecting NUAST's reputation for great mathematical talent.

Year 10 and 11 students will be taking part in the Intermediate Mathematics Challenge in the new year, with the junior mathematics challenge for Year 7 and 8 in late spring and a chance for our first ever Year 8 regional team competition.
