Oxbridge

I am delighted that we have a total of six students who have received offers from Oxbridge Universities (four from Cambridge, two from Oxford). This is an excellent offer rate from 7 interviewees and 9 applicants and means that, pending results, around 10% of our year group will go to the top two universities in the country.

Subjects include Natural Sciences, Physics, Psychology, Mathematics and Computer Science.

This comes after a year of hard work by students and staff, which began with a visit to Oxford University last March. Students have had a programme of preparatory lessons on the application process, including guidance on personal statements and admissions tests as well as mock interviews. These young people are now doing everything they can to ensure they meet their offers to take these outstanding opportunities.

Results

We are once again very happy to be the most successful sixth form college in the city of Nottingham and one of the most successful in the country. Our validated Value Added score of 0.42 is considered "well above average" (the highest rating) by the DFE. Only 5% of schools nationally fall into this category. In addition, we were the highest state-funded sixth form in Nottingham for average points (34.8). We also had the highest percentage of students achieve AAB in facilitating subjects (43.5%) of any school of any type in the whole of Nottinghamshire.

This underlines NUAST as the best performing state Post-16 provider in Nottingham for the third year running.

DANCOP Day

Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire Collaborative Outreach Programme (DANCOP) invited our Year 10 & 11 students to Nottingham College to inform and inspire them about their options for next steps.

Our students were a fantastic credit to NUAST as they threw themselves into the different activities and spoke confidently to a range of different educators and employers. Students met with representatives from a variety of universities, the Armed Forces and Rolls Royce, to name a few.

Students came back to school with a real buzz of enthusiasm about their future ambitions.
